On **Maundy Thursday**, April 1, 7pm, we will gather together at Table on Facebook

The evening will begin as it did for the initial disciples with the breaking of bread so as you gather have a cup with wine or juice and bread nearby. Following the sharing of the bread and cup, we will hear Mark's account of Jesus' Passion as read by members of First Parish. As your fellow disciples read, listen that your soul may sing,



"What wondrous love is this! that Christ should come in bliss to bear the heavy cross for my soul."

This service will be livestreamed on <u>Facebook</u> from the Sanctuary of First Parish beginning at 7pm.

The evening concludes with the stone being rolled against the door of the tomb." Mary

Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses saw where the body was laid." So be sure to join us also on Easter Sunday when the women return and the story continues anew.

On **Good Friday**, April 2, the Sanctuary of First Parish will be open between 12 pm and 3pm for prayer and meditation. The windows will be opened to keep the sanctuary ventilated and we will continue with the pandemic precautions of being masked, socially distanced, and well.

On **Easter Sunday**, April 4, our Easter Service will be available on <u>Facebook</u> when you wake.

At 10:30 am you are invited to join over**Zoom** with your church community for communion on Easter Sunday. Again, please gather with a cup of juice or wine and bread nearby.

Following Communion, we will continue on **Zoom** as we receive five persons (Ned & Laura Hall, Mary Masi-Phelps, and Cedric & Linda Saripalli) into membership at First Parish of Westwood.

And then at 11:30 am, families are invited to an outdoor Easter Egg Hunt. If you have not registered, please do. Again, we will continue with the pandemic precautions of being masked, socially distanced, and well.

Join us as we celebrate the cruciform pattern of Jesus' life and our own as we move through intensifying darkness and constricting fear into dawning light and freeing faith. May it be so again ... and again.

Sermon Shaping *On the Patio* Sundays, beginning April 11th 10:30AM

Join your pastors and other church friends for *Sermon Shaping* on the Sundays of Easter beginning April 11. Each Sunday we will look at the lectionary reading for the next Sunday.

- **On April 11** we will discuss the readings for April 18, the Third Sunday of Easter: Acts 3:12-19, Psalm 4, I John 3:1-7 and Luke 24:36b-48.
- On April 18 we will discuss the readings for April 25, the Fourth Sunday of Easter: Acts 4:5-12, Psalm 23, I John 3:16-24, John 10:11-18.

Please note that in the season of Easter, instead of readings from the Hebrew scriptures, we read from the Acts of the Apostles which is the account of the early church.

When we gather on the patio, we need to continue being vigilant: wear masks, stay socially distanced, wash hands. By being outside we are well-ventilated. Should weather drive us inside, we can open all the windows in the Fellowship Hall and spread out. As we move towards May and June, we anticipate that more and more of us will be fully vaccinated.

Mark Your Calendar - Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd



"For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face." I Corinthians 13:12

When Paul wrote this metaphor of how love clarifies our vision, mirrors were polished metal -- and we are not talking about stainless steel – thus a mirror offered a reflected image but distorted. A community structured through love – and Paul was referring to a community and not a couple – is like being known *face to face*.

Living with Covid-19 has meant living a "reflected life" through Facebook, Zoom, Facetime, Duo, and multiple other platforms that kept life and work going. Now as a greater percentage of people are vaccinated and the virus caseload has been receding, we are able to start planning for community life that will more closely approximate "face to face."

We are not there yet so we will continue being socially distanced, masked, washed, well and well-ventilated. Just look at the near-zero rate of influenza this year to confirm how well these practices work!

It is time to start planning and practicing life in this next stage of living with Covid-19.

- **On Maundy Thursday** we will live-stream a service on Facebook in which a dozen of us will gather with all the recommended precautions to read the Passion narrative in Mark's Gospel.
- **On Easter Sunday**, our families will have an Easter egg hunt at church. Again, with all the recommended precautions (and if interested, please sign up in advance).
- On the Sunday after Easter, April 11, the Pastors will offer a study of the Bible texts recommended for the coming Sunday on First Parish's Patio with the precautions of being socially distanced, masked, washed, well and well-ventilated.
- On Pentecost Sunday, May 23, our Worship Ministry is planning to invite us to gather in-person for worship. This date gives us all time to plan and, if necessary, change plans.


