Encountering the Word

THE DAY'S PSALM

Reader: Charlie Domina Psalm 23, New Century Psalter

Psalm 23 is perhaps the best-known text of the entire book of Psalms. Throughout our tradition it is commonly used at funerals due to its comforting imagery. However, this is also a psalm for everyday living.

God is my shepherd, I shall not want,

God makes me lie down in green pastures,

and leads me beside still waters;

God restores my soul,

and leads me in right paths for the sake of God's name.

Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil;

for you are with me; your rod and your staff - they comfort me.

You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies;

you anoint my head with oil, my cup overflows.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life,

and I shall dwell in the house of God my whole life long.

LESSON John 10:11-18, *NRSV*

The image of Jesus as a shepherd is rooted in the understanding of the crucifixion-resurrection so central to John's gospel. Like a shepherd who willingly gives his life in care of the flock, Jesus chose to give up his life in faithfulness. In the exercise of his faithful ministry Jesus fulfills God's promises.

[Jesus said]: "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

Reader: Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church.
