# Sermon Shaping *On the Patio* Sundays, 10:30AM

Join your pastors and other church friends for Sermon Shaping on the Sundays of Easter. Each Sunday we will look at the lectionary reading for the next Sunday. And, if you want to make an observation about this morning's sermon, we can talk about this Sunday's sermon as well as preparing for next Sunday's worship!



- On **April 18** we will discuss the readings for April 25, the Fourth Sunday of Easter: Acts 4:5-12, Psalm 23, I John 3:16-24, John 10:11-18.
- On **April 25** we will discuss the readings for May 2, the Fifth Sunday of Easter: Acts 8:26-40; Psalm 22:25-31; I John 4:7-21; John 15:1-8.
- On **May 2** we will discuss the readings for May 9, the Sixth Sunday of Easter: Acts 10:44-48; Psalm 98; I John 5:1-6; John 15:9-17.

When we gather on the patio, we need to continue being vigilant: (1) wear masks, (2) stay socially distanced, (3) wash hands, (4) be well and (5) stay well-ventilated. By being outside we are well-ventilated but should weather drive us inside, we can open all the windows in the Fellowship Hall and spread out. As we move towards May and June, we anticipate that more and more of us will be fully vaccinated.



We are currently seeking volunteers to do a "Welcome to service at First Parish" video. We encourage you to get creative and have fun.


